Aisha Byas, who is a nurse at St. Johns and grew up in the neighborhood on Twin Lakes Drive and our final member is Chris Daum who is located at the front entrance close to Superior and Twin Lakes Drive. As a board, we are trying to get more members involved in everyday functions of our community. We have approved the Lake Committee with Brent Ramsey and Steve Koskey as Co-Chairmans. They will meet and discuss improvements on bridges, ADA paved areas, our dam, and improving areas to fish. We will have several other committees form so others can get involved. Smaller branches can be broken up & placed in yard waste bags or containers as part of

the City's bi-weekly yard waste pickup.

Branches must be placed curbside by 7:00 a.m. on the Monday of your pick-up week. DO NOT place branches or brush on the center boulevard.

Be mindful where you place branches! The city asks everyone, to avoid placing branches and yard waste on: manholes, handholes, junction boxes, meter pits, stand pipes, sprinkler heads, inlets, drains, poles/posts, guy wires, general equip/structures, sidewalks, bike lanes, or boulevards.


Sweeping or blowing leaves or grass clippings into the street is a City violation and doing so could result in a fine.



Sorry, no chickens have been reported crossing the bridge but we do have many families that ride bikes. walk, run, etc. along the Twin Lakes Drive bridge, and as much as we don't like them, we have many many geese that frequently hang out there. For fear something bad will happen, a few residents living near the bridge have kindly ask drivers to move their vehicles. The board was notified some residents have been threatened multiple times by drivers/fishermen and police are having to get involved. The board notified NPO Officer Dorsey of this issue and she's working with us on additional measures to help protect the residents around this area. The city is also working with the board on additional measures that can be put in place to stop drivers from parking on the bridge. Thank you to the many residents that have been parking behind the NO Parking signs. We appreciate your help as we try and keep the area safe. Parking on the bridge is for emergencies, maintenance personnel, and for board members to drop off/clean up events (i.e., garage sale, fireworks, etc.). These signs are posted on the bridge for a reason and violators are being reported. The safety of our residents is top priority!
