BIRD FLU GUIDANCE AND REPORTING

In mid December 2024, a board member reported multiple sightings of dead geese in both lakes and on common grounds. The next day, another five (5) dead geese were seen and this information was reported to the Department of Natural Resources (IDNR) who are monitoring mortality avian influenza (bird flu) events in waterfowl, aquatic birds, and birds of prey throughout Illinois.

Test results received (our results are not in) so far indicate highly pathogenic avian influenza (HPAI) as the cause. IDNR issued a Press Release on 12/20/2024 and is available on their website.

Here are some key points from ID-NR's recommendations:

- Avoid handling sick or dead birds.
- Keep pets away from bird carcasses.
- Use protective gear like gloves, masks, and goggles when disposing of dead birds.
- Wash your hands thoroughly after handling birds or bird carcasses.
- Cook game meat to an internal temperature of 165°F. Avoid handling sick or dead waterfowl found in the field.

If you develop flu-like symptoms after exposure to sick or dead birds, contact your local health department and inform healthcare providers of your exposure. For more detailed information, you can check the IDNR press release on their website.

"While avian influenza generally poses a low risk to the population, it is essential to take the necessary steps to avoid exposure, and to seek treatment quickly if you are exposed." said IDPH Director Dr. Sameer Vohra.

Branch Pickup is NOT Leaf Pickup / Yard Waste. Branch Pickup happens four times a year. Branches must be



placed curbside by 7:00 am on the Monday of your pick-up week. DO NOT PUT branches or brush on the center boulevard. **Smaller branches** can be broken up & placed in yard waste bags or containers.

Avoid placing branches/yard waste on: manholes, handholes, junction boxes, meter pits, stand pipes, sprinkler heads, inlets, drains, poles/posts, general equip/structures, sidewalks, bike lanes, etc.
